

Minutes from February 17th meeting

The meeting was called to order and the membership approved the January minutes. There were 11 members and 2 guests, Captain Decker from DCSD and Davis Chinnis, our County council representative.

The Treasurer reported we currently have a balance of \$690 in our savings account.

The Webmaster emailed reminders to as many members as he has valid addresses for. He has continued to place the current minutes on the website for members who are unable to attend.

The Secretary reported that the entry decorations for Valentine's Day were well received and she will decorate for Easter.

The President's report included questions about the conditions of our streets and ditches. Rita will write a letter to the person in Dorchester County responsible for these issues and report back on any answers (Jerry Blackwell.) We can go to Dorchestercounty.net for pot hole information.

We had no reported old or new business.

Our District representative, C. David Chinnis was introduced and spoke at length about current issues in the County. A law about smoke free establishments did not pass. A question about the Pine Trace subdivision plans was raised. Mr. Chinnis reviewed the changes and discussed what might happen in the future. At this time the project is on hold due to financial issues.

Captain Decker gave his report about "hot spots" in the neighborhood, and reported on the Citizens Academy which is still taking applicants. Call 832-0330 for information. He reported about 13 calls answered since our last meeting. He gave us the phone number 877-4-litter to call if we see people littering.
