

MINUTES FROM APRIL 18, 2013 Meeting

The Webmaster called the meeting to order at 7PM. The members indicated they had read the minutes. There was a correction of the date for the next meeting: May 16, not April as printed. A motion to accept minutes was accepted.

Treasurer:

- The Treasurer's report was not available due to Dave's travel however the savings balance was estimated as \$695.

President:

- The President's report noted that the front entry had been mowed. No other problems noted with signs. It was noted that several of our streets are in poor condition, Carmon & Beatrice among others.

Webmaster:

- Nick read a letter from a member on Carmon St. reminding us that the number of cars parked around 101 Carmon is a hazard as it is difficult to see oncoming traffic when turning onto Greenhurst St. due to the presence of a car and trailer parked there most of the time. She noted there are often 6 or more cars parked around the 101 property and at times in early evening may be as many as 9-10 cars there.
- The problem with loud music is back again as well.

Secretary:

- Marina will ask new neighbor on left side of Greenhurst Street to pick up trash if possible.
- Flags will go up for Memorial Day.
- New flowers were planted.
- The Secretary reminded members that National Night Out is rapidly approaching (AUGUST 6Th) and if we plan to do anything different we need to put a plan together.
- Also June is ELECTION TIME. Our offices run 2 years so this May we need to have nominations for President, Treasurer, and Co-coordinator. Elections are held in June.

Sheriff Department: Our guest from the Dorchester Sheriff's Dept. was Sgt. Petrey.

- He noted the March 22 raid which resulted in 9 arrests and confiscation of drugs.
- He addressed some of the comments from the letter read earlier by saying that if the Stop signs are blocked by the parking at 101 Carmon DOT can be called to report the problem as well as the people parking half out in the street at times.
- He repeated the non-emergency number to call to report loud music.
- He stated there was not much activity in Greenhurst last month, with a few burglaries, theft from motor vehicle on Miles Rd., and theft of a motor vehicle on Roberta being the main complaints. He cautioned us to remain alert for unfamiliar vehicles or strangers walking in the area.

Old Business:

- The two property owners who came to a prior meeting have not let us know what is happening.
