

## MINUTES FROM APRIL 17TH MEETING:

Our Treasurer opened the meeting at 7PM. There were 11 members present including 3 new families: Cydni R from Bailey Dr., Jen S. from Terry Ave., and Charles and Monica from Edythe Ct

Correction from April minutes : Our representative from Dorchester County Sheriff's Dept. is LT. J. Barnhill (not Captain). David Chinnis, our elected County Councilman was also present.

The Treasurer reported there was no change in our financial status. Balance remains \$595.73.

The President remarked that the Center entry posts need painting and the bushes need trimming. The Secretary will get over and paint the posts. Dave will trim the bushes.

The Webmaster reported he has put the most recent minutes and crime reports up on the web. A member asked for the number of Mr. Campbell who picks up scrap metal. That information is on our website <http://www.greenhurst.org>. His name and number is Bill Campbell 729-8768.

The Secretary said she would take Easter decorations down and put up something appropriate for Mother's Day. Monica offered to help with planting flowers and other decorating .

A member reported trash in a yard of an empty home at 517 Brailsford. He was advised to call CODE ENFORCEMENT at 832-0013. Be aware that the home owner is allowed a period of time to accomplish this.

New Business: Some of the new residents were in need of phone numbers to report problems with loud neighbors, fighting and trash. The Secretary asked Mr. Chinnis about the DOT pickup of limbs and debris from the storm. Greenhurst was partly picked up but still has lots of limbs on Chalmers, Blackwell, and Miles Rd.

Lt. Barnwell reported that our crime calls have continued to be lower than usual and gave the Crime Watch group kudos for being pro-active. He noted there had been one drug arrest. He provided the non-emergency number for the new members. 873-5111. Tell the responding officer you need a report. If you do not want an officer to come to your house because of possible threats let the officer know. IF YOU CALL 911 understand that 2-3 officer's will be dispatched. You can also ask to have your house placed on watch if you are out of town.

Mr Chinnis brought us up to date on the new schools to be built, including Gene Sires Elementary which will be near the Coastal Center. This school should be open by Aug. 2015. There will be about 130 homes built on 300 acres in the area of the school. The Roundabout to allow traffic into the area will be under construction soon.

Mr. Chinnis is running for re-election in June so he reminded all of us to be sure to vote in JUNE for the candidate of our choice.
